Succeeding in today's world requires exposure to new opportunities, confidence to pursue them, and a network of champions to help every step of the way. The Network's 40 high schools serve 12,350 students across the U.S. Cristo Rey students across the country earned nearly \$76 million towards their own private high school education costs through corporate jobs in the Corporate Work Study Program. Their success continues onward through college. Cristo Rey graduates are three times more likely to complete a bachelor's degree within six years than their demographic peers. The entrepreneurial Network of high schools is developing in young people the character and aspiration to realize their full potential in education, career, and most importantly – in life.

ABOUT DETROIT CRISTO REY HIGH SCHOOL

Cristo Rey school in Michigan. It is sponsored by <u>The Basilian Fathers</u> and the <u>Sisters, Servants of the Immaculate Heart of Mary</u>. The Congregation of St. Basil's motto for the is, <u>Teach me goodness</u>, <u>discipline and knowledge</u>. And the IHM community's mission is, <u>Urged by the love of God</u>, <u>we choose to work with others to build a culture of peace and right relationship among ourselves</u>, with the Church and with the whole earth community.

DCR is located in Southwest Detroit's Historic West Vernor – Junction District, less than four miles from downtown. The school occupies the former Holy Redeemer High School building on a campus it shares with Most Holy Redeemer Parish and Holy Redeemer Grammar School.

DCR's 2024-25 enrollment was 270 students. Ninety three percent of DCR students identify as Hispanic/Latino, followed by 5% Black, and 2% White. In the finest of Catholic tradition, DCR welcomes students of all faith traditions. All students participate in a yearly retreat and celebrate Mass as a school community.

DCR provides an excellent college-preparatory education, including AP courses. Since 2012, 100% of DCR's graduates were offered college admission. Seventy-eight percent of the Class of 2023 enrolled in college within one year of graduation (66% 4-year, 12% 2-year,) earning \$11.35 million in college scholarships.

The school's 2023-24 budget was \$4.8 million, with an average cost per student of \$17,871. Fundraising revenue was \$2.2 million, accounting for approximately 45% of operating expenses.

Like all Cristo Rey schools, DCR is proud of its Corporate Work Study Program, which includes many of Detroit's most respected law firms, hospitals, banks, businesses, and nonprofit organizations. Students earn up to half of their own tuition while gaining valuable workplace experience and developing the confidence and professional skillsets that will give them a competitive advantage in college and careers. Approximately 42% of DCR's operating revenue is earned through the CWSP.

The Cristo Rey Network's Mission Effectiveness Standards

An innovative funding model

The Corporate Work Study Program (CWSP) is an innovative and transformative model wherein students work one day per week, every week throughout the academic year to offset the cost of their private college preparatory education. The CWSP is more than just a means to cover education costs. It is a transformative journey that opens doors to a brighter future, breaking the cycle of limited opportunities and paving the way for Cristo Rey students to achieve their dreams.

The financial model of Cristo Rey schools is structured such that, when the school has reached full enrollment, fees from the CWSP (paid by employer sponsors) are expected to cover approximately 50% of a student's tuition and generous benefactors (and school vouchers in some states) will contribute approximately 40%. Cristo Rey families will be asked to contribute what they can afford, covering approximately 10% of a student's tuition.

The CWSP operates as a separate entity, acting as a temporary employment agency within the school. It shares common board governance and management with the school.

ABOUT THE POSITION

As the organizational leader, the President/CEO is ultimately responsible for the school's Catholic identity, educational excellence, and financial strength. S/He will be critical in establishing the culture of the school as well as representing the school in the greater Detroit community.

This President/CEO's role is largely external facing and forward looking. S/He will be expected to be a high-profile ambassador for Cristo Rey in the Detroit business, philanthropic, and faith communities. S/He will focus on community engagement, fundraising, strategic planning, organizational development, and financial sustainability. As a school that serves only students with limited economic resources, the President/CEO will lead a substantial ongoing fundraising and corporate sponsorship recruitment effort every year to secure resources.

The President/CEO will be hired by, and report to, the Board of Trustees. DCR uses the President-Principal model of leadership, wherein the President/CEO will lead a team that includes the following direct reports: Principal, Vice President of Development & Communications, Vice President of Sales & Operations / Corporate Work Study Program, Chief Financial Officer, Director of Admissions, and Director of Operations / Chief Technology Officer.

The President/CEO will inspire organizational and professional confidence from a wide variety of stakeholders. Her/His primary relationships include business, religious, and civic leaders; donors; the Cristo Rey Network; the Basilian Fathers; the Sisters, Servants of the Immaculate Heart of Mary; senior school administrators; and board members. In the President-Principal model, the Principal's primary relationships include faculty, students, and parents.

CAREER PATH

The Cristo Rey Network has found that successful schools are led by leaders with broad institutional- and executive-level experience from a wide variety of fields. Experience in Catholic education is desirable, but not required. Candidates demonstrating organizational leadership and chief executive skills from nonprofit, business, health care, social services, public service, military, and other fields are encouraged to apply.
